

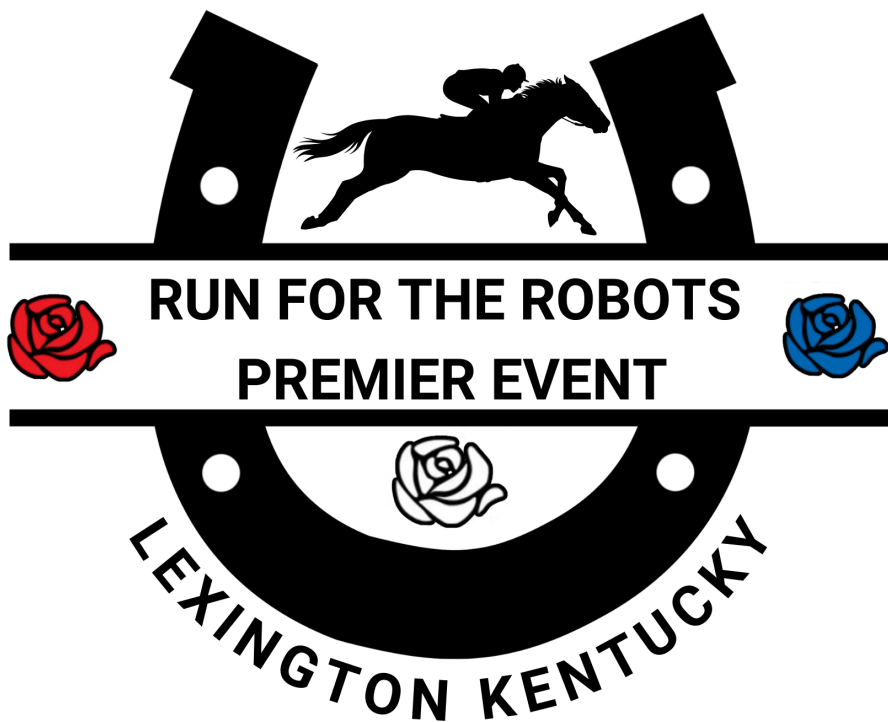

Volunteer Registration Required

To receive your volunteer t-shirt, badge, and any event swag, you must be registered in the *FIRST* Volunteer System. This ensures that we have the required forms and can officially assign you to your role.

Here's What You Need to Do:

1. Log in or create an account at firstinspires.org
2. Complete the following:
 - a. *FIRST* Consent & Release form (acknowledgement form)
 - b. Youth Protection Screening (required for adults)
(*Note: We cannot assign you to a role until both are complete.*)
3. Navigate to the Volunteer Dashboard
 - a. Choose *FIRST* Tech Challenge as your program
 - b. Filter for Kentucky events
 - c. Locate *Run for the Robots*
4. Select your preferred roles and enter your availability

Training Reminder

Please make sure you check your volunteer dashboard to ensure you are up to date on any training or certification that is needed for your role.

All event volunteer roles have access to *FIRST*® Training upon application. You will see a blue "*FIRST* Training" button in the "Volunteer Registration" tab of the *FIRST* Dashboard. Clicking this button will grant you access to the *FIRST* Training platform.

If your role requires online training, you will be automatically enrolled into the training upon application or assignment into the role. A "Roles Missing Certification" section will appear on your Volunteer Dashboard. Click on "Review Outstanding Tasks," then click the "Resolve" button. This will take you directly to the training site.

Volunteer Community

We have a private Facebook group just for *Run for the Robots* volunteers. This space is designed to help build community before, during, and after the event.

In the group, volunteers can:

- Connect with each other ahead of the event
- Share plans, tips, and logistics, including finding roommates for the duration of the event
- Coordinate after hours activities and explore what Kentucky has to offer, like bourbon tours, local restaurants, and attractions
- Ask questions and support one another throughout the event

Event Snapshot

Run for the Robots is a Premier International *FIRST* Tech Challenge (FTC) Event, and we are incredibly proud to host it right here in Kentucky. One of only twelve events like this worldwide, Premier Events showcase high-level international competition. Teams had to qualify to attend by performing well at their state, regional, or national championship events.

Hosting this event is a major milestone for Kentucky. While we are still small in terms of *FIRST* footprint, we are growing rapidly. It is a chance for us to welcome the world to Kentucky and show what makes our community so special.

This event features two divisions, which will operate independently through qualification matches, playoffs, and division-level awards. However, the event will culminate in

combined finals, where top alliances from each division face off, as well as combined event awards including the Team Spirit Award, and Gracious Professionalism Award.

The event spans four action-packed days:

- **Wednesday** –
 - Set up throughout the day, ending at a reasonable hour. We need a lot of volunteer help this day!
 - Volunteer Movie night! Our big center screen will be set up with sound ready so we'll relax with some pizza and popcorn and watch Wall-E on the big screen. All volunteers welcome – expected start time is around 6:00 PM EST
- **Thursday** –
 - Set up throughout the day
 - Teams arrive for check-in, judging, and robot inspections in the afternoon (3:00 PM is when we need to be ready for them)
- **Friday** –
 - Opening Ceremonies begin at 9:00 AM
 - Qualification matches begin after opening ceremonies and continue throughout the day
 - Special guests will participate in Behind the Bots tours in the afternoon
- **Saturday** –
 - Remaining qualification matches in the morning
 - Alliance selection, playoffs, and division awards in the afternoon
 - Combined event finals and final award presentations
 - Tear down (We need your help!)

Across the venue, there's more to see and experience:

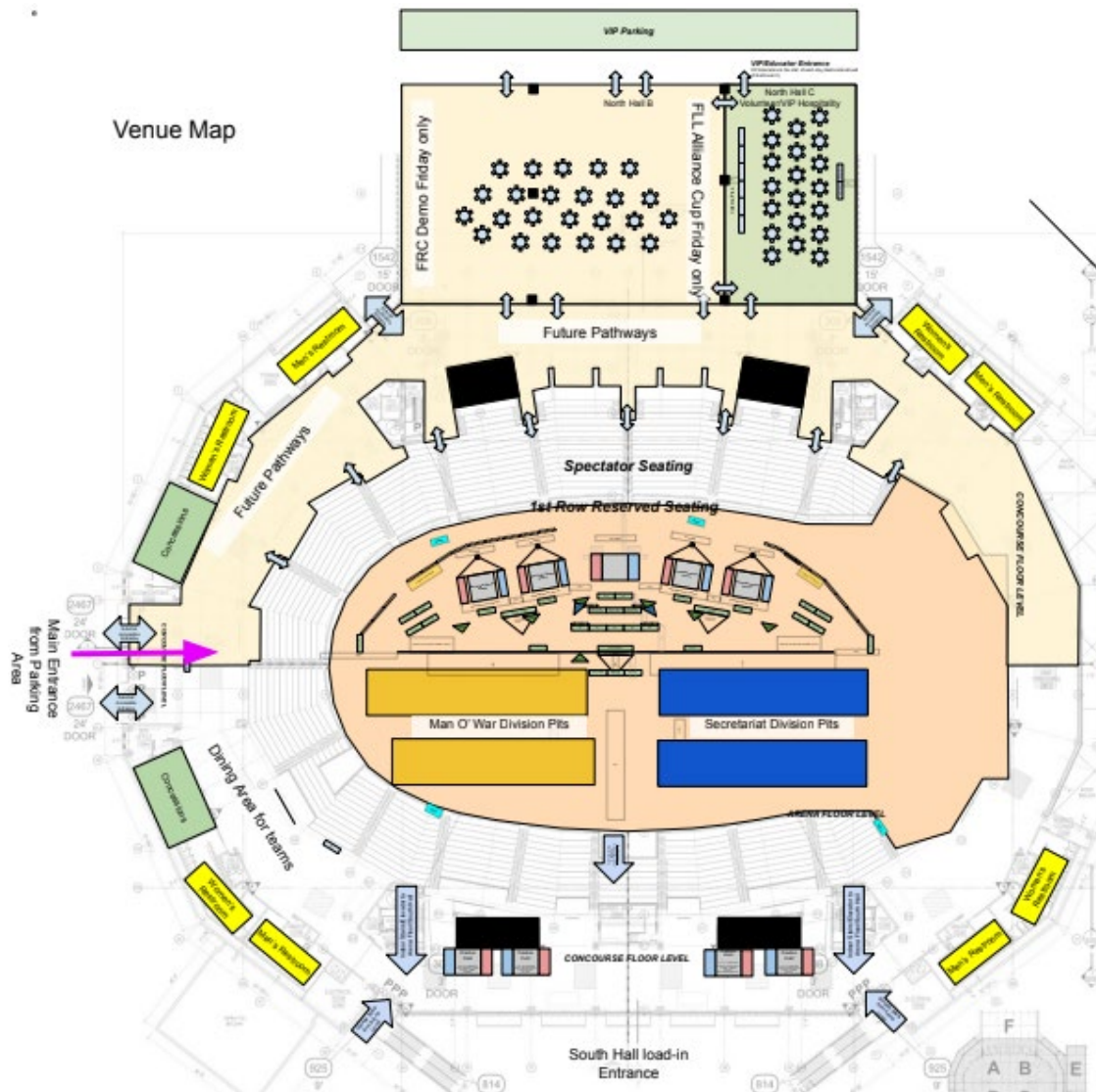
- The North Hall will feature an FLL Alliance cup mini-event & and FRC team showcase

- The Concourse will feature our Future Pathways zone led by an amazing display from our Presenting Sponsor Toyota and filled with industry, colleges, universities, and other partners

What to Bring

Safety goggles or safety rated glasses with side shields are required when accessing the team pits or competition area. Extras will be available on site if needed.

Water bottle

Comfortable close-toed/heelled shoes—there may be lots of walking or standing

What to Wear

You will receive a mint green volunteer shirt upon check-in for your event days. You may purchase a second shirt from our onsite vendor if you'd prefer a fresh one for the second day.



- Wednesday & Thursday Setup Day: Volunteers should wear KY *FIRST* Robotics shirts if they have one. If not, we will provide a shirt as long as supplies last.



- You will want to wear comfortable pants and close-toed shoes. Any role-specific items such as vests, referee shirts, etc. will be provided to you.
- *FIRST* events ARE FUN! These students work hard and these events are where they celebrate the season. You are welcome to wear funny hats, ties, shoes, etc. – especially those volunteering on and around the field.
- Safety glasses (or safety rated glasses side shields) are required near the fields and anywhere where a robot is being worked on or operated.
- All volunteers will receive a badge with a name tag, and it will be pulled from the *FIRST* database so ensure that your preferred name is correct there.

Parking Instructions

You will park in the main lot outside the front of the Alltech Arena. Please drive all the way to the front of the building.

Day 1 Entry Instructions

Driving Directions to the Kentucky Horse Park – Alltech Arena
 For *Run for the Robots* Volunteers

Location: Alltech Arena, Kentucky Horse Park
Address: 4089 Iron Works Pkwy, Lexington, KY 40511

From the North (I-75 Southbound):

- Take I-75 South toward Lexington.
- Exit 120 for Iron Works Pike / KY-1973.
- Turn left (east) off the exit onto Iron Works Pike.
- The main entrance to the Kentucky Horse Park will be on your right after about 0.3 miles.

From the South (I-75 Northbound):

- Take I-75 North toward Georgetown/Cincinnati.
- Exit 120 for Iron Works Pike / KY-1973.
- Turn right (east) off the exit onto Iron Works Pike.
- The main entrance to the Kentucky Horse Park will be on your right after about 0.3 miles.

Entering the Horse Park – Volunteer Parking Instructions

As you enter the Kentucky Horse Park grounds, you will approach a parking attendant booth.

Important:

Please present a printed copy of your *Run for the Robots* volunteer parking pass that we emailed to you. This is how they will verify your access.

Once you provide your printed pass, you will receive a physical parking permit that is valid for all days of the event. Please keep this in your car for re-entry.

A note on parking passes:

KY *FIRST* Robotics covers the cost of these parking passes specifically for our event volunteers. We know that some of you are arriving with your teams, but we kindly ask that these passes be used only by volunteers. Our budget is very tight this year, and your cooperation helps ensure we can continue offering these resources.

To Alltech Arena (Once on Horse Park Grounds)

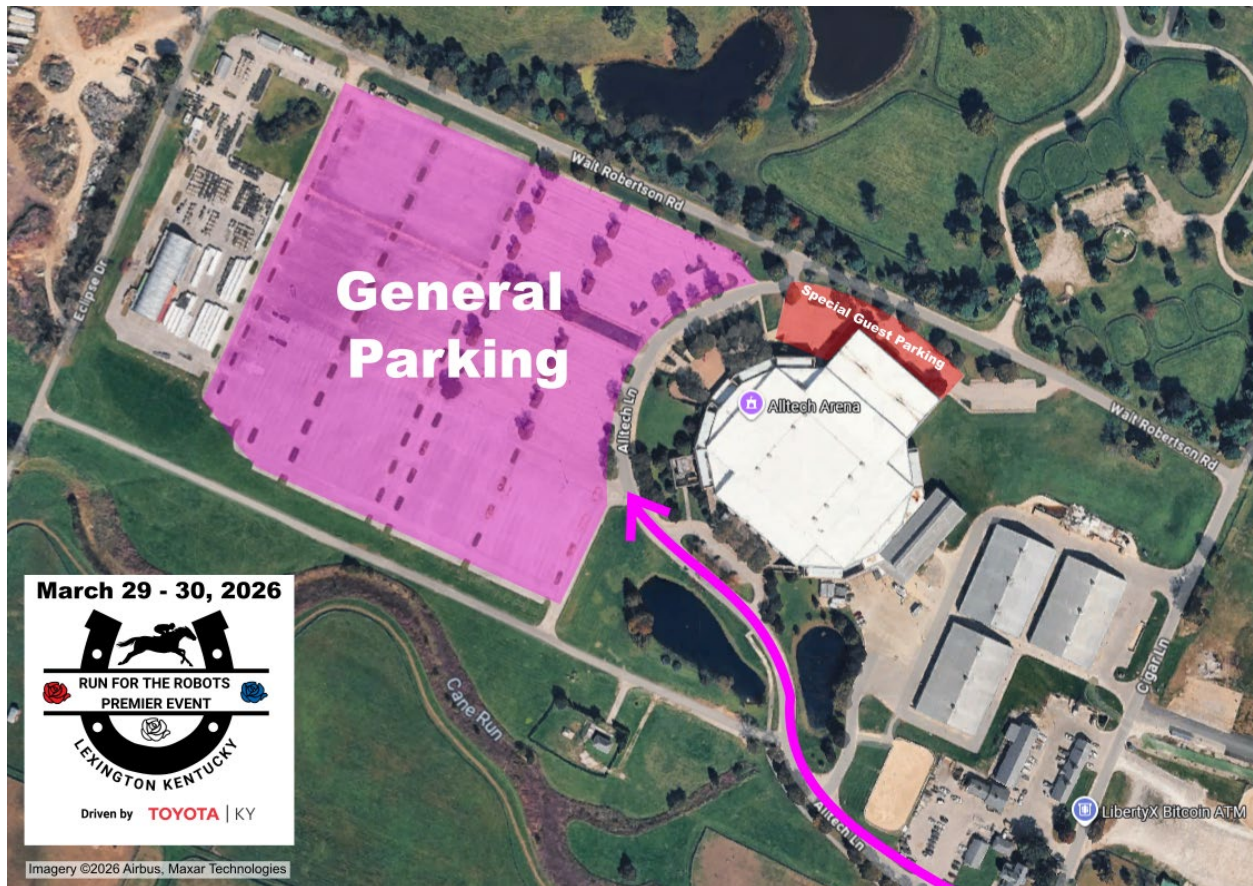
After passing through the main gate and receiving your parking permit:

- Follow signage or volunteer directions to Alltech Arena.

- Volunteer parking areas are shown on the attached map.
- Park in the designated lot and proceed to the main arena entrance

When you walk in the main doors, proceed to your left to the very last entrance of the North Hall. It will be labeled for Volunteers only. Inside that room, you will receive your shirt, lanyard, and instructions for where to report. This room is where your refreshments will be served throughout the event.

Volunteer Lounge Locations

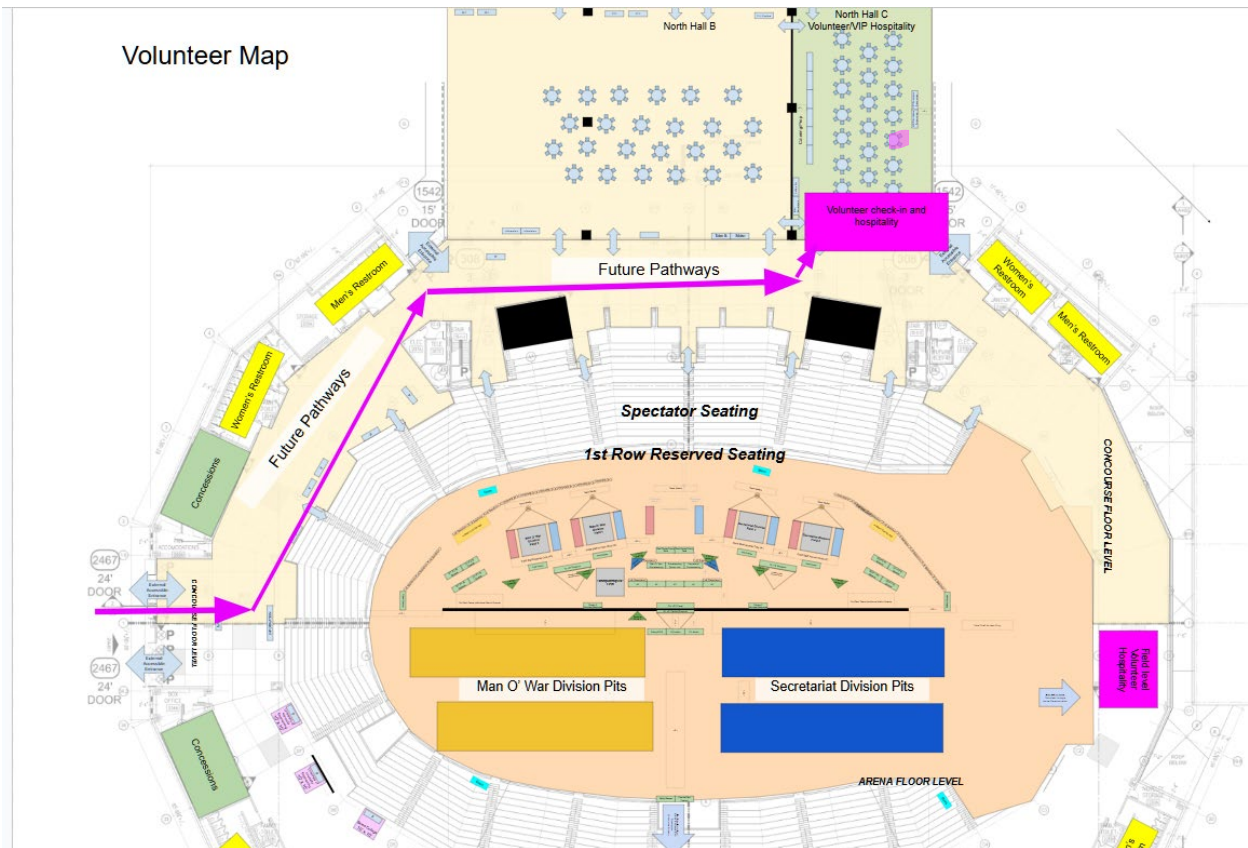
There are two volunteer lounges available to support you throughout your time at *Run for the Robots*.

The main lounge is in the North Hall where you check in upon arrival. You may also pick up badges and volunteer swag, volunteer pins, passports with stamps, and other items you are welcome to take for your collection. This lounge is stocked with snacks and drinks throughout the day for volunteers and is where all volunteer meals are served. This space offers a quieter area to rest, recharge, and connect with fellow volunteers.

Arena Floor Map with Volunteer Check-in & Hospitality Room

There is a smaller hospitality room on the arena floor, next to the judge deliberation room. This is for volunteers on the arena floor who may not have time to go up to the big room for a snack or quick quiet break. Snacks and drinks will also be available throughout the day.

Enter through the main entrance each day, which is on the concourse level. Both hospitality rooms are marked here in magenta. These two rooms are available throughout the event.

These lounges are reserved for event volunteers and shared with special guests and student ambassadors. We ask that you help us maintain a welcoming environment by demonstrating gracious professionalism and respecting the intended use of these spaces.

We recommend that you store personal items in a safe place near your volunteer station, as the lounges are not secure storage areas.

Meals will be provided on the days you are scheduled to volunteer. If you have dietary restrictions or specific needs, please let us know as soon as possible and we will do our best to accommodate them. You can email Kelli Gowan at kelli@kyfirstrobotics.org with those needs.

Access Badges

Each volunteer will receive an access badge at check-in. Badges are assigned to the individual whose name is printed on them and should not be shared. They serve as your pass into volunteer-only areas, including lounges and certain event zones.

Badges will be provided on lanyards, and we encourage you to make them your own—add your favorite pins and flair to show off your personality and *FIRST* spirit!

Special Guests & Event Access

You may see special guests throughout the event, including educators, sponsors, community leaders, and partners. These guests are invited to learn more about *FIRST* programs and see the impact of your work firsthand.

- Behind the Bots: Friday, May 29 time 2:00-4:00 pm in Alltech Arena and the pit areas

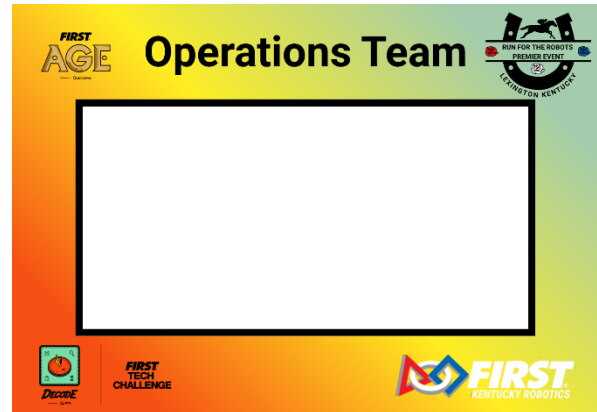
If we have special guests attending other times during the event, they will be badged and guided by student ambassadors.

Themed Activities and Extras

Jockey Silks

You'll see colorful jockey silk designs throughout the venue—they're part of the fun and tradition woven into this Kentucky-themed event.

- Division Themes
Each competition division is named after a legendary racehorse:
 - Man o' War Division
 - Secretariat Division

Each has its own custom jockey silk design that you'll see on signage, field banners, and more.

- Special Guest & Ambassador Badges
 - Special Guest and Student Ambassador badges feature jockey silks inspired by Triple Crown winners.
 - Educators and their ambassadors will wear badges with a design based on Seabiscuit's silk—a nod to resilience and impact.
- Team Creativity
Each team was encouraged to design their own jockey silk to showcase their unique identity. Keep an eye out for some truly imaginative and creative designs from teams across the event!

Explore the Concourse & North Hall

When you have a break in your shift, we encourage you to take time to explore more of what this event has to offer.

- Future Pathways (Concourse):
Visit local industry partners and *FIRST* vendors showcasing exciting technologies, career pathways, and support for robotics teams & events.

- North Hall (Friday only): This area will be very active on Friday, May 29th with an FLL mini-event and an FRC showcase. Try to stop in and learn about those programs!

Theme Days

We're bringing some extra personality to the event with daily themes—and volunteers are absolutely encouraged to join in!

- **Friday: Hometown Pride**
Wear something that represents your hometown, state, or country. Show off your roots and celebrate where you're from!
- **Saturday: Derby Day**
Embrace the Kentucky spirit with Derby hats and bow ties. Whether you go bold or subtle, it's all about joining the fun.

No pressure—just a great way to add energy and community spirit to the event. We can't wait to see what you come up with!

Safety & Conduct

Creating a safe and respectful environment is a shared responsibility, and your role as a volunteer is a key part of that. *Run for the Robots* brings together students, families, and community members from all over the world, and we want everyone to feel welcome and supported.

Quiet Spaces

There will be a few alcoves available during the event as quiet spaces for anyone needing a break from the noise and activity. These areas are intended to be calm, respectful, and restorative.

While these spaces will not be continuously supervised, spot checks will be made throughout the day by event staff. Please help us ensure:

- There are no one-on-one interactions between adults and students in these spaces (except for parent/child).
- These areas remain appropriate for quiet use and are respected as shared spaces.

If you see anything that raises concern, please notify a member of the Operations Team (orange-to-green gradient badge) or the Info Table right away.

Behavior & Professionalism

FIRST students are known for practicing Gracious Professionalism, and we're proud of the way they represent their teams and communities. Still, everyone can use a reminder from time to time. If you observe behavior that's off-track, a friendly and respectful reminder is often all it takes to bring things back into line.

You might say:

- "Let's make sure we're representing our teams in a positive light."
- "That's not really appropriate for a robotics event—can we do better?"
- "Hey, remember this is a shared space—thanks for keeping it respectful."
- "Let's reset and make sure we're staying professional out here."

Safety Glasses

Safety glasses are required:

- Near the fields or anywhere a robot is being operated
- Anytime someone is working on a robot in a pit, those near should wear safety glasses.

If someone forgets, offer a polite reminder.
