#### JOIN THE FUN AND VOLUNTEER AT A FIRST EVENT

*FIRST* hosts more than 3,700 events around the globe annually. Volunteer roles range from fun squads and safety glass monitors to judges, emcees, and referees. Volunteering at an event is a great way to share technical or professional knowledge, but you do not need special skills or expertise to volunteer.

## BE A MENTOR OR COACH WITH A FIRST LEGO LEAGUE TEAM

Mentor and coach roles and responsibilities can include:

- Supporting playful, hands-on learning through guided questions, empowering team members to make critical decisions
- Helping the team set realistic goals and follow season guidelines
- Facilitating meetings and helping the team orchestrate the work
- Ensuring a process for all team members to engage in each part of the challenge and season
- Handling administrative responsibilities such as event registration
- Communicating with parents, guardians, or other family members
- Supporting the team at events, reviewing any feedback with the team, and celebrating their accomplishments with them after the event
